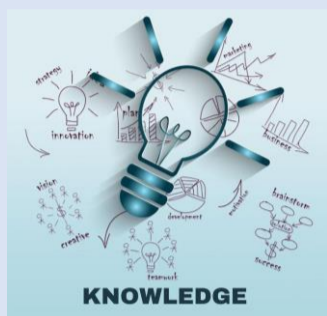

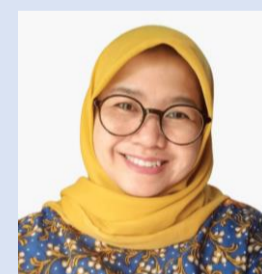
This lecture underlines the necessity of transforming 'Indonesian Islam' from a 'religious culture' to a 'knowledge culture'. Indonesian Islam embodies the acclimatization of Islamic virtues in the context of Indonesia, thereby creating a unique cultural framework. Indonesian Islam should be understood as an evolving identity and a religious culture that can serve as an inspiration for a knowledge culture. Dr. Widiyanto argues that a religious culture in a specific Muslim society has implications for the modes and characteristics of a knowledge culture within that society. The same can be said about Indonesian Islam. Hence, it is significant to elaborate on the Indonesian Muslim knowledge culture by exploring the inspirations derived from the Indonesian Muslim religious culture.

Asfa Widiyanto is a Professor of Islamic Thought at the State Islamic University in Salatiga. He obtained his doctorate from the University of Bonn and his master's degree from Leiden University. From 2011 to 2013, he undertook postdoctoral research at the University of Marburg and the University of Bamberg, under the supervision of Prof. Dr. Claudia Derichs and Prof. Dr. Patrick Franke.



Esra Tiryaki is a doctoral researcher at the Institute of African and Asian Studies of Humboldt University, Berlin. Her PhD project focuses on Islamic higher education in Malaysia and Turkey, and its overarching discourses from a historical-comparative perspective (1980s-1990s).

Dr. Nor Ismah is a Co2libri Fellow at Humboldt University and Vice Director of ISAls at Sunan Kalijaga State Islamic University of Yogyakarta, Indonesia.
